BISHOP'S VISITATION

The Right Reverend Douglas Fisher, our bishop, made his official visit to Trinity on June 18. In his sermon he said, "It's good to be with you today. It's wonderful to be with you at Trinity. I pray for you all every day. This is my sixth summer as your bishop. I know that in this time there's been lots of transitions at Trinity. I am here to offer my encouragement, hoping for a thriving Church here in Shrewsbury. And I know with God's grace that is very, very possible. So thank you. So thank you for going through all the transitions. Thank you for calling Ron to be the Priest-in-Charge here... and thank you, Ron, for accepting."

"Saint Paul in his wisdom, has this great pattern that he tells us about in today's reading that there is suffering, suffering leads to endurance and endurance leads to character and character leads to hope. It's quite a pattern." Bishop Doug cited the stories of the Woman at the Well, Doubting Thomas, the Centurion in Capernaum, and St Paul's use of the phrase, "Once I was...but now I am..." as examples of people moving through the pattern from suffering to endurance to character to hope. He invited each of us and all of us as a Trinity community to see our times of transition as times of moving through the great pattern from suffering to endurance to character to hope.

During the service he also offered his blessing to individuals for their life and ministries. Almost all who attended came forward for his blessing. He also commissioned members of the Vestry and Eucharistic Visitors. Following the service, Bishop Doug joined us at Coffee Hour and then met with the Vestry for about an hour offering words of support and encouragement as well as exploring resources available to Trinity during this year of development. All in all, his visit was supportive, encouraging and helpful and we thank him for his visit.

VESTRY CORNER

The Trinity Vestry met on June 8, 2017. Here are the condensed highlights of that meeting:

Warden Report – Catherine

- Shrewsbury Vacation Bible School, to be hosted by Wellspring at Trinity from Jul 31 Aug 4, has been postponed.
- Catherine discussed the need to clean up the play area and Labyrinth and will need help on this project when planned.
- Trinity received the Fire Inspection Certificate, although the ventilation system over the gas stove in the kitchen was cited for repair, which is already in the works.
- Water found on the lower level floor after recent heavy rains raised concern. We'll be keeping an eye on this in case repairs are necessary.

Update on Mutual Ministries - Carolann

• Mount Olivet has invited us to participate with them in the Spirit of Shrewsbury in September. Carolann will get more information which is needed before a decision can be made.

^{*} The parish office is closed for 'vacation day Fridays' until September.

• Mount Olivet has invited Trinity to worship with them on July 16th outdoors at Dean Park and to share a pot-luck brunch following the service.

Treasurer Report – Jeff

- Y-T-D Income and Expenses are on target, although "Current Year Pledges" for May are down.
- The Treasurer may combine the two different software programs we use to just one for convenience and ease of operation.
- The Vestry voted to purchase a Fax/Printer for the parish office for \$69.

New Business

- Catherine presented the list of Eucharistic Visitors for approval. Sherry Alarie, Catherine Foster, Allan Jarrell, Linda Taylor, Pam Marshall and Jen Morin are on the current list.
- Based on the competitive pricing in the community, the Vestry voted an increase in fees to rent the Trinity facilities.
- The Vestry approved the display of the Pride Flag in front of the church as a symbol of our community with all people without regard for or judgement of their sexual orientation.
- The Bishop will be here on June 18 to "Celebrate and Preach, and to Bless the Vestry and the People." A coffee hour will take place after the worship service, followed by a brief visit with the Vestry.

Old Business

- Sherry Alarie reported a successful week for Trinity at IHN (Interfaith Hospitality Network), although more help is needed to keep this initiative alive and active.
- The Worship Service Time Survey will be delivered the week of June 11; deadline for returns is June 23.
- An already active summer schedule along with members' vacation plans, etc., prompted the Vestry to postpone renting the dumpster for cleanup and furniture/rubbish removal until fall.
- The Vestry decided we probably should participate in the 'Spirit of Shrewsbury' and will need a committee to examine options and budget impact.

Parish Direction

- The Vestry adopted an 'Effective Vestry Meeting Format' to ensure all of our meetings stay informative, constructive and efficient. The Vestry meets at 6:30 PM on the second Thursday of each month if any parishioners wish to attend.
- The Vestry discussed the liturgical ministries in play on Sunday mornings and how some are not as successful as others, which may require that written norms and additional training be added to improve outcomes. Vestry plans to explore further.
- Fr. Ron expressed his desire to get to know and interact with Trinity's membership. His intention is to 'check-in' with everyone from time to time and asked for the Vestry's help in getting to know us. We also suggested that he might use some time on Sunday mornings during the sermon to engage with the congregation as he has done on a couple of occasions, so far.
- Supply priests are confirmed for some of the Sundays during July: Rev. Meredyth Ward (7/2), Rev. Warren Hicks (7/23), possible joint worship with Mount Olivet at Dean Park (7/16). July 9 and 30 are still open as of this writing.

THE YEAR OF DEVELOPMENT: APRIL 30, 2017 TO APRIL 30, 2018

The first Twelve Minute Parish Meeting of Trinity Church was held on June 25, 2017, in place of the sermon at the 9:00 0'clock liturgy. The meeting was opened by Catherine Foster, Senior Warden, with Carolann Tebbetts, Junior Warden, as timekeeper. Fr. Ron Crocker, Priest-in-Charge, facilitated the meeting.

The idea of holding the Twelve Minute Parish Meeting during the liturgy came from suggestions at a Vestry meeting that this would be a convenient time to facilitate a conversation between parish leadership and the congregation about what is happening during our year of development.

Our goal for this year of development is for Trinity Church to be a sustainable, missional, Episcopal parish in Shrewsbury. This is in keeping with our mission statement.

Fr Ron's role as Priest-in-Charge is to work with Vestry and other lay leaders to maintain worship and preaching, pastoral calling on the sick and shut-ins, general administration of the congregation, teaching the congregation, evangelism and outreach.

Fr Ron spoke about what we have accomplished so far.

- We have engaged a Priest-in-Charge for 20 hours per week who holds regular office hours to help coordinate program.
- He has regular meeting with Wardens and staff
- He has helped train Eucharistic Visitors who begin service this summer.
- The Vestry has finished an opinion survey on the time of services for this coming year.

Next steps our Vestry has discussed include

- Evaluating current ministries
- Establish standards for Vestry and Guilds
- Find ways to engage the wider community.

Members were asked to share their greatest hope for the year and their greatest concern for the year. Greatest hopes for the year included increase membership, embrace change, and get our name out in the community. Someone said, "I want to win Power Ball." This was humorously followed by how Trinity would use the ten percent given to the parish.

Greatest concerns were that, as a lay led and lay managed community which now has a part time priest, we would become too comfortable with this model, move away from our lay led model,; we won't embrace new ways of doing things, and we may not look to the future but maintain the status quo and not reach out beyond our walls. Financial concerns included increasing the number of families pledging as this is one indicator of whether people are with us in our mission.

The meeting took 14 minutes and we were all invited to continue the conversation during Coffee Hour and at Vestry Meetings.
